Speaker Biographies

David Doniger, Policy Director, NRDC (National Resources Defense Council) Climate Center:

David is the policy director of NRDC's climate center, focusing on policies to cut global warming pollution from power plants, motor vehicles and other major industries. David also leads NRDC's work to complete the phase-out of chemicals that deplete the earth's protective ozone layer. David rejoined NRDC in 2001 after serving for eight years in the Clinton administration, where he was director of climate change policy at the Environmental Protection Agency and, before that, counsel to the head of the EPA's clean air program; he also worked for a year at the Council on Environmental Quality. David first began at NRDC in 1978 and worked on clean air issues for the next 14 years, helping to win adoption of the landmark Montreal Protocol (to stop depletion of the ozone layer) and the Clean Air Act amendments of 1990.

Gillian Caldwell, Executive Director 1Sky:

Gillian is a film maker and an attorney with thirty years of experience advocating for social justice in the United States and around the world. Since she began as the first Campaign Director in September 2007, 1Sky has grown to become one of the largest collaborative campaigns in the United States, building a society-wide movement in support of bold federal action to tackle global warming. The 1Sky campaign now combines the force of more than 500 allied organizations, a team of 50 staff in 31 targeted states, more than 168,000 climate advocates and more than 2,000 volunteer “Climate Precinct Captains” covering every state in the country.

Gillian was formerly the Executive Director of WITNESS (www.witness.org), co-founded by musician Peter Gabriel, which uses the power of video to open the eyes of the world to human rights abuses. She is also co-editor and author of a book published by Pluto Press called *Video for Change: A Guide to Advocacy and Activism* (2005). Gillian was formerly the Co-Director of the Global Survival Network, where she coordinated a two-year undercover investigation into the trafficking of women for forced prostitution from Russia and the Newly Independent States that helped spur new anti-trafficking legislation in the US and abroad. Gillian lived in South Africa during 1991 and 1992, investigating hit squads and security force involvement in township violence, and has worked in Boston, Washington DC and New York on issues related to poverty and violence.

Maureen Howard:

Maureen joined Citizens for Global Solutions as the Development Coordinator in July. She studied Political Science and International Peace Studies at the University of Notre Dame. Maureen brings to Citizens for Global Solutions her experience working and researching abroad. She interned in Uganda for the African Network for the Prevention and Protection Against Child Abuse and Neglect and later returned to Uganda to conduct research for her senior thesis. While studying in London for a semester, Maureen interned in the British Parliament.

Don Kraus:

Don Kraus is the Chief Executive Officer of Citizens for Global Solutions and co-chair of the Partnership for Effective Peacekeeping (PEP), an NGO working group. Previously, Don served as the Executive Vice President at Citizens for Global Solutions, where he directed the Government Relations Department and the Political Action Committee.

Don has also served as the Executive Director of the Campaign for UN Reform (CUNR) and its affiliated political action committee, CUNR PAC. An expert in building U.S. legislative and government support for the UN, Don brings his considerable enthusiasm and drive to lobbying and electioneering. Don compiles the Global Solution Report Card, an annual assessment of congressional voting records.

He has been quoted in the NY Times, the Washington Times, the Washington Post, the Boston Globe, and many other publications. He has been interviewed on CNN, BBC, NPR, and many other radio and TV shows.

Don is also the past president emeritus of the Center for UN Reform Education, a UN reform think tank. He currently serves on the advisory board of the United Nations Association, National Capitol Area.

Anu Joshi:

Anu Joshi is the National Outreach Coordinator of Citizens for Global Solutions. Anu manages and supports chapter activity and stimulates political will and activism in organization members. In addition, Anu will be managing and supporting the newly created Network for Responsible Global Policy.

Anu is a native Californian and spent 6 years at the University of California, Berkeley earning her undergraduate degree in Political Science and her Masters Degree in Social Welfare. While at Berkeley Anu was active in student government and community organizing. She was the Chair of the No on Proposition 54 Statewide coalition and served as President of the UC Student Association representing 200,000 students to the Legislature, Governor and UC Regents. After receiving her Masters in Social Welfare, Anu worked as a Child Welfare Worker in the San Francisco Bay Area for 2 years. In July of 2008 Anu quit her job, packed up her car and drove from California to rural North Florida to work as a Field Organizer for the Barack Obama Campaign.

Speak the Same Language at Copenhagen

Say it in Metric Tons

Dear Editor,

We are standing together today with our family and friends asking the countries at Copenhagen to “All Speak the Same Language” and to express it in metric tons. We need to know and hold these countries accountable to aggressively reducing greenhouse gas emissions so that the children in my neighborhood can enjoy the beauty of the *[my area]* far into the future.

How we talk about climate change commitments matters. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) -- which represents the consensus of the international scientific climate change community -- issued the gold standard of climate reduction goals. They call for a of 25% to 40% greenhouse gas reduction of 1990 levels by 2020, if we are to avoid catastrophic effects. This translates to a reduction requirement of 13 to 16 billion metric tons by 2020 or we are all in deep trouble. This is the figure that we must keep our eye on.

Greenhouse gas reduction goals are the underlying currency of efforts to halt climate change. These goals are typically expressed in the arcane formula of “percent reduction from base year by a given end year.” For example, Canada’s goal is to decrease its greenhouse gas output by 20% below 2006 levels by 2020. Germany’s current goal is 8% below 1990 levels by 2012. The “Waxman-Markey” legislation passed in the U.S. House of Representatives calls for 5% to 17% below 2005 output by 2020. It’s like an Olympic race where each runner chooses their own start and finish lines.

That’s why we are urging all countries to express their commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in metric tons and to take the important steps towards fighting climate change together.
